As from the 1<sup>st</sup> of June 2007, all raw trophies received for mounting by the taxidermists, **must** be accompanied with the relevant permit and/or an adequate fencing certificate.

If the taxidermists do not receive the required documentation, they **will not be allowed** to keep the trophies on their premises.

If any trophies have been handed in for mounting before the 1<sup>st</sup> of June 2007 but will only be collected after that date, a permit must be applied for in **advance**, in order to collect the trophies from the taxidermist and to transport them to their end destination.

This law is applicable to all hunters, hunting outfitters, farm owners, private individuals, and taxidermists nationwide.
